Principal's Report November 2nd, 2023

- We have had an excellent start to the school year! Our new staff, and veteran staff, are working well together, as demonstrated during our first PD session at the end of September. All EA's, teachers, and our YSW have listed different strategies they will implement to closely connect with students. This is a part of our Social Emotion Learning focus for this school year.
- Last spring, our grade 7-9 students completed the COMPASS survey. This survey reported results in many aspects of comprehensive health for teenagers. The survey was completed in a number of schools with grade 7-12 students. From the ideas and direction of the students, we are going to follow their suggestions to respond to this report in a variety of different ways. Some of these areas include healthy eating/positive body image, vaping/smoking/alcohol, and bullying to name a few. We plan to share the results at the next Home and School Meeting, if that would fit in the agenda.
- Three actions we have as a school is booking MADD Canada to come and do a preventative driving under the influence, a vaping presentation from Lung NS/PEI and the UPEI student nurses, and have booked with La Tablee Des Chefs from Montreal to healthy eating and positive body image with our grade 7-9 students. Jackson Adam and
- the grade 9 class filled out a Federal Grant form to pay for the sessions.

 As part of our support of Truth and Reconciliation, we have added the 7 Sacred Teachings to our Bulldog of the Month assembly and winners for the month. The 7 Sacred Teachings have lessons around Truth, Respect, Love, Humility, Courage, Wisdom, and Honesty. For exploration classes, the grade 7-9s went to teach all about these topics to the grade K-6s. It was well received! Students did an excellent job. Thanks to the teachers who helped with this project (Mr. Johnson, Mr. Ellis, Mrs Edward, and Mrs. Carpenter).
- We are inviting families to come to the Bulldog Assemblies (started in October)
- This year, we are also doing a new initiative by our staff leadership committee called "Kindness Shout-Outs". Any staff guest at the school can submit a shout-out if they notice an act of kindness. We are in week #2 of the initiative. We have recognized 20+ students to date! I'm sure more are to come...
- Sports had a great fall with many of our students involved in the lineup with cross country, golf, volleyball, and cross country. Wresting Team is also operating through the school week. Cross country had 19 participants with four going to Provincials. Kayley Carter was 20th, Simon Beck 48th, Syrianna DeSousa 63td, and Elsa Laybolt 93td. The girls volleyball team finished with a record of 3-3, but lost the tie breaker to advance to the Provincials. The <u>boys</u> volleyball team finished with a record of 2-3, and advanced to the Provincial quarter final before losing a close match, 3-2, to Queen Charlotte. The boys golf team had two teams this year. We had 6 boys play in the qualifier at Avondale golf course, but nobody advanced to the Provincials. For the girls, we had 4 golfers who all advanced to the singles for Provincials (Kayley Carter, Abbie Bell, Ally Myers, and Milla Beck). Abbie was our top finisher at 5th place. The girls scramble team of Abbie, Ally, and Milla won a silver medal, breaking a 4 way tie with a birdie on the last hole.

- . Thanks to the Home and School and staff volunteers who made the Halloween Spooktacular such a great event! We had lots of positive comments about the <u>event</u> and hope it can happen in the future. The grade 9's raised \$575.00 in the canteen. Extra shout out to Tonia and Rose for the donation of popcorn and cinnamon rolls, and decorations
- We sent our grade 7/8 class to the Art Discovery Day at the Confederation Center of the Arts. The students had a very enjoyable day! I realize the day has already come and gone, but I am wondering if the Home and School would make a motion to cover the cost of the transportation for the day (approximately \$250). It is not a problem for the school to cover the cost, if the feeling is not to support the bus.

 We also had the Earth Rangers Presentation at the school. They brought in some
- animals, and shared information with the students
