Dental Clinic:

Dental Preventative Clinic at Belfast Consolidated starting October 3, 2023 Purpose of Dental Clinic: Screen children to assess risk of oral disease; provide oral health education, topical fluoride, scaling/polishing and sealants, according to your child's individual needs. Screening: All children will be seen for a two-minute screening to determine their risk of oral disease. If you do not wish your child to have this dental screening, please notify the school secretary or classroom teacher.

Consent: After the screening, all children will be given a consent form which will be necessary for you to complete and return before services are provided. **Fees:** There is no cost involved as the preventive services are covered by the School Dental Care Program.

Contact: If you have any questions about the program, please contact the dental staff at the School or the Dental Public Health Clinic in Charlottetown at 902-368-4918.

Further Information: Please note that only preventive services will be provided and the screening is not a substitute for an annual dental examination. It is strongly recommended that parents take their children to a dentist for regular examinations and treatment. The Provincial Dental Care Program assists with the cost of basic dental care delivered in private and public dental offices. After School Changes:

To ensure the safety of your child, the school **MUST BE INFORMED BY A NOTE OR PHONE CALL IF YOU ARE:**

1) planning on picking your child up, when they usually travel by bus

2) sending your child home with someone else3) planning to have your child travel on his/her regular bus but getting off at a different stop4) planning on sending your child on a different bus for babysitting purposes

If the school has not received any notification from you, your child will follow their regular routine.

Water Bottles:

Remember to send your child(ren) to school each day with a refillable water bottle. Our school is equipped with refill stations. Please also label the bottle with your child's name.
